




Distribution Report March 2018 to August 2018

Overview:

Once again Rise Against Hunger Africa has shown significant in growth in the number of beneficiaries we support. In line with the objectives we set ourselves in 2017, we have also grown the number of Early Childhood Development Centres in our ECD Connect programme.


The area with the biggest growth in the ECD Connect programme is KwaZulu Natal where we have doubled the number of crèches brought onto the programme. We now have 62 ECD's in that Province with over 2 400 learners receiving nutritious meals on a regular basis.

We continue to make an impact in the foundation phase space in assisting ECD's to develop and improve their centre facilities and go on to become compliant with the Department of Social Development standards. Year to date we have exited 18 ECD centres.




Impact and Quality:

Two of our main focus areas concerning distribution for 2018 have been around making a meaningful and sustainable impact with the beneficiaries we support. This has been achieved by more in-depth monitoring and evaluation, informed guidance with the programme objectives and creating partnerships with organisations who specialize in teacher training, educational toys and infrastructure.



University Students:

We are continually growing the number of universities we engage with to assist students who are food insecure. Through the Food Banks which have been setup at the various institutions, students are able to receive our nutritious meal packs. We are also starting to focus on TVET Colleges as there is a huge need for food support at many of these facilities.
